JOYFUL SPRING CLEANING

Until Marie Kondo writes a guide to joyful outdoor cleaning and tidying up, we're on our own when it comes to caring for our outside spaces. Here's a handy checklist of items all homeowners should attend to.

Home Exterior

- ✓ Pressure wash siding, decks, walkways, and driveway
- ✓ Repair and replace rotted wood as needed
- ✓ Remove roof debris (it causes leaks!)

Yard

- ✓ Trim hedges and bushes to 4' or shorter
- Remove weeds, overgrowth, and debris
- ✓ Ensure yard art is tasteful and moderate

Hardware*

- Repair gates and fencing as needed
- ✓ Purchase or replace your house number plaque
- ✓ Repair or replace your house light if it's broken
- ✓ Repair or replace your mailbox as needed
- *We're identifying homes with missing or broken house number plaques, house number lights, and mailboxes in need of repair or maintenance. We can save time and money by scheduling repair and installation services for our residents on the same days. This is an ongoing effort that will continue through summer. For those of you who want to take action now, vendor information is attached.

If we had them, our landscape rules and regulations would speak to yard art, flags, and potted plants; standard alternatives to railroad ties; edging options; bushes, shrubs, hedges, and trees; and types of mulch, or yard coverings, to use.

AN IMPORTANT LAWN CARE UPDATE!

Massey Lawn Care will be servicing our trees, shrubs and groundcover jasmine in odd-numbered months; lawns will be serviced in the even-numbered months. So with this new treatment schedule, we'll be targeting lawns and weeds in June. Please remember . . . when you see the Massey signs, be sure to water your lawns within 48 hours (otherwise the treatment has little effectiveness).

CHEMICAL PRECAUTIONS

To minimize the exposure you, your family, and your pets have to the chemicals used in Massey's lawn treatment, follow these precautions.

- Be sure grass is completely dry before you allow your kids or pets to walk on it.
- Be sure to keep your kids and pets away from lawns where these products are in use.
- Be sure your pet always has plenty of fresh drinking water. Discourage your pet from drinking water from puddles that accumulate from water runoff, which may contain significant amounts of chemical residue.
- Lastly, you can have your pet's urine tested for atrazine contamination by your vet on a regular basis. Early detection may reveal the presence of, and treatment for, cancer.

CAUTION: DRIVING HAZARDS

We've received complaints about vehicles parked on the roadsides in our neighborhood for extended periods of time.

They pose problems when they block the vision of oncoming cars, as residents try to avoid hitting them as they go in and out of their driveway, and even as they block access to a fire hydrant.

Our parking restrictions allow residents to park in their driveways and in designated parking spaces. Be courteous of your neighbors, and use your driveway and parking space. If you need more space, maybe a neighbor has a space you can use? It costs nothing to ask. Thank you all for your support!

WHAT'S AN ARCHITECTURAL CHANGE REQUEST?

The Architectural Change Request form (located on the web site under Administrative Documents) is used to obtain required approval for any change, improvement, addition, reconstruction, or attachment to the exterior of your home or your lot. This includes your roof, vents, gutters and downspouts; exterior building surfaces, doors and windows; trees, bushes, yards, and landscaping; and additions or changes to structures on the lot.

It's not nearly as hard as it sounds. Just fill out the form and let us know what you'd like to do. Any documentation you can provide will be helpful. Provide pictures of the tree you want removed, or the yard you want to landscape. Describe what plants you want to add, and where.

We can provide approval quickly when you use the correct form with the information we need. If you make changes without the required approval, your only risk is that you'll have to undo or redo your changes in accordance with HOA regulations, which may result in additional costs to you. And no one wants that to happen.

We appreciate you working with us to maintain our great little community.
